Yasuhiko Arakawa received his PhD degree in Electronics and Electrical Engineering in The University of Tokyo, Japan in 1980 and became a full Professor in 1993. He is currently Director of Institute for Nano Quantum Information Electronics, The University of Tokyo and the President of Commission of Optics (ICO). He has contributed to pioneering research on quantum dots and nano-photonic devices, as well as leading several big national projects in Japan.

For his achievement, he has received several major awards, such as Leo Esaki Award (2004), IEEE/LEOS William Streifer Award (2004), Fujiwara Award (2007), Prime Minister Award (2007), Medal with Purple Ribbon (2009), IEEE David Sarnoff Award (2009), C&C Award (2010), Heinrich Welker Award (2011), OSA Nick Holonyak Jr. Award (2011), and JSAP Achievement Award (2014)
